

Frequently Asked Questions

1. If a member is CEO/President of a non-profit organization can the organization apply for the grant?

Yes, as long as the Link member is not also a member of The Links, Incorporated Executive Council, The Links Foundation, Incorporated Board of Trustees, The Links, Incorporated National Philanthropy Committee, or The Links, Incorporated National Grants and Grants-in-Aid Committee.

2. If a member serves on the board of a nonprofit can the organization apply for the grant?

Yes, as long as the Link member is not also a member of The Links, Incorporated Executive Council, The Links Foundation, Incorporated Board of Trustees, The Links, Incorporated National Philanthropy Committee, or The Links, Incorporated National Grants and Grants-in-Aid Committee.

3. Should a member excuse herself from the vote of an organization seeking board approval to apply for the grant?

The member should follow the conflicts of interest policy for the applying organization.

4. Will applicants receive a confirmation that the application has been received?

Yes.

5. Is there a limit on the number of pages that can be submitted?

While there is no limit on the number of pages that can be submitted, concise and succinct answers are appreciated.

6. Will an applicant be notified if their packet is incomplete?

No.

7. Define relationship with a Links chapter?

To the extent that a member of The Links, Incorporated is familiar with the applying organization, a letter in support of the organization's application for a Legacy Grant would be useful.
